FETITION ON TRAMWAY ELVD. IMPROVEMENTS NEARS COMPLETION

Remove from oven; sprinkle with $\frac{1}{2}$ of a 6 oz. pkg. chocolate chips; spread caramel mixture over; sprinkle with $\frac{1}{2}$ C. chopped nuts (if desired); pat with remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ of the dough. Sprinkle with remaining chocolate chips. Return to 350 oven for another 20 minutes. Cool. Cut into squares.
