Our Board is a very "political group." There exists a wide divergence of opinion as to who and what we represent in the community. That is why we need your participation in defining these parameters.

I would, therefore, urge each Association member to become familiar with the voting records and activities of the Board and to attend the annual meeting on Saturday, 3 June 1989, 10:00 a.m. at the

Tramway/Paseo del Norte Project

From the Desk of Commissioner Patricia Cassidy

It was necessary to delay bid opening for Tramway/Paseo del Norte because several property owners raised objections to our obtaining right-of-entry for construction of the Project. A hearing before a judge is scheduled for April 25th. John Ramsey will set a date for bid opening as soon as the right-of-way problems are resolved.

We now have preliminary engineering about 95 per cent completed for all of Tramway Boulevard from Montgomery north to the Indian Reservation.

The resignation of a staff person resulted in a delay in advertising for bids for small projects. We now have plans and specification nearly complete for bidding the overlay of Tramway Lane from Live Oak Road to Big Horn Ridge Road. We should be accepting bids for this work before May 15th.

BCFD #5 Auxiliary Group

The Volunteers of District 5, Community Volunteer Fire Department, voted at their last business meeting to expand their membership to include auxiliary members. District 5, headed by Chief Clark "Sparkie" Speakman, provides fire protection and emergency medical services for Sandia Heights, Tierra Monte, and North Albuquerque Acres. As part of the Volunteer Department, an active Cadet membership program is already in place.

It is envisioned that the Auxiliary, consisting of both men and women, would assist in, and partake of the nonfire or emergency related activities of the Department, such as the annual picnic, the annual Christmas Eve activities and lunch, and other social functions. Of course the auxiliary would assist the members in these functions as well as others, namely, department record keeping, fund raising endeavors, and other supportive activities. The Auxiliary would function as a permanent committee of the Department, under the guidance of the Chief and the members. The only requirements for membership are to reside in the area, and a desire to provide some of your personal time to assist in the


workings of the Fire Department.

As each year goes by and the area increases in population, the number of emergency calls increases, which requires more time of the Volunteers. This, in addition to increased record keeping imposed by Federal, State, and County governments, has placed a tremendous burden on the active members of the Department. A portion of the work load has been relieved by the Cadets who are able to participate in some of the fire emergency and training activities, and they have done an outstanding job in this area to date.

For those of you, who are interested in joining the District 5 Fire Department Auxiliary, and would like to volunteer some of your time for your community, there will be an organizational meeting held at the Paseo del Norte Fire Station on Tuesday, May 16th, 1989 at 7 p.m. If you cannot attend this meeting, please call the station at 293-4275 and leave your name and telephone number so that we can contact you. More Animal **Problems**

There have been reports that people are placing poison out on their lots in an attempt to kill covotes and other wild animals. As a result, pets have eaten the poison and have died. If you are having a wild animal problem, notify the Environmental Health Department, Mr. Curt Montman, 768-2600. Residents are reminded that County Ordinance 83-37 prohibits animals to run at large or to disturb the peace by barking and howling. Violation of the Ordinance is punishable by a fine of up to \$300 and/or imprisonment of up to 90 days. County Animal Control can be contacted at 843-7895.


Special Refuse Pickup




THE VIEW FROM JACKRABBIT HILL

NOT TOO BIG, NOT TOO SMALL

All around us in the Sandias, shrubs are growing that are adaptable to our gardens and that live happily here in our dry climate and sandy Sandia soil. Two favorites are large saxifrages - cliff fendlerbush (fendlera rupicola) and our fragrant native mockorange (philadelphus microphylla). Saxifrage means rock breaker and in spring you can see these good-sized shrubs with their large white blooms growing in the rocks in Juan Tabo Canyon and beneath the tram as you ride up the mountain. Both are handsome shrubs with large (1") flowers in the spring, the shape of the fendlerbush flowers being unusually attractive. The lovely wild currants and gooseberries are also






in this family. Six are listed for the Sandias, but the native <u>ribes</u> found most frequently in the nurseries is the attractive golden currant with profuse small yellow flowers and golden fruit. It has been a successful landscape plant.

Any of our gardens can use the New Mexico native sumac, lemonade berry (<u>rhus trilobata</u>). It has a variety of names -- oakbrush sumac, skunk bush. I planted a 1-gallon lemonade berry, gave it water from time to time the first year and have forgotten it since. Now two years later, it is a respectable 3' shrub that turns a nice gold and red in the fall before it drops its leaves. So far, it has been ignored by the bunnies, but is beloved by the birds who take its berries before I ever have a chance to see them turn red. Eventually it should be 5 or 6 feet tall and at least as wide. Its pleasant cousin, the wooly sumac (rhus trilobata pelosissima) grows in many of our draws; look along lower Live Oak Road for them. It turns a soft yellow in the fall. Though it seems happily impervious to drought, it also apparently thrives on extra water. One of mine got the drainage from a new patio and had spread to about 12' across while staying about 6' tall. In summer, it is usually filled with birds that love its cover.

And, do you have a shady spot that freezes hard in the winter that you have despaired of planting? You might want to try the native redtwig dogwood. It is especially beautiful in the winter against the snow and is handsome the rest of the year as well, having white flowers in the spring and a nice red color in the fall. It comes from the high mountains so needs a bit more water than some plants from lower elevations; it would be happy on drip watering on a north side.




