Your SHHA Community Services & Membership Committee (CS&MC) is happy to announce that Sandia Heights Services (SHS), who provides our solid waste collection services, will begin a curbside recycling pilot program for collection of mixed plastic, paper, cardboard, aluminum and tin on your regular trash collection day every other week starting on November 2, 2009. Participation is voluntary, and all you have to do is sign up for the service by calling Sandia Heights Services at 857-8924 or sending in the coupon that will be inserted in your next billing statement.

Simply place your recyclables in clear plastic trash bags or plastic grocery store bags, and put them out for pickup on your recycle collection day by 7 a.m. Cardboard must be flattened and bundled and tied with twine or rope into bundles weighing less than 40 lbs. Styrofoam and glass are not allowed. All recyclables will be collected by a dedicated truck that will collect only materials for recycling.

### **SHHA** membership cards

There will be a nominal fee of \$4.50 per month added to your SHS bill to cover the cost of pickup, transportation and processing. The pricing is such that the customer will provide their own clear plastic bags, or you may also use the plastic grocery store bags for containing the recycling materials. Your recyclables will be delivered to Durango McKinley Paper where they will be separated and shipped to end users. SHS will pay a tipping fee and receive no money for recyclables delivered to Durango McKinley, they in fact have to pay them to take them!

SHHA CS&MC is excited about this new program and encourages all residents of Sandia Heights to sign up. The success of the pilot program depends upon residents' participation! We hope that participation will be such that this service will be implemented as part of SHS's normal solid waste collection services in the future. The Committee, primarily through the dedicated work of its Volunteers, has been hard at work for nearly a year to bring curbside recycling to our community. The more who sign up, the more we will recycle, and the result will be less solid waste going to the landfill. # Plague in our neighborhood?

Have you noticed any dead animals around your house lately? There have been several reports recently of dead animals in our neighborhood. Remember these dead

animals should never, ever be handled because of the possibility of plague. Plague is a naturally occurring, flea transmitted disease of rodents and rabbits. Infected rodents usually die, leaving plague-infected fleas, which then find new rodent or human hosts.

Plague infected animals and human cases have occurred mainly in mountainous eastern Bernalillo County and in the western foothills of the Sandias. Humans can contract plague in three ways: (1) By the bite of plague infected fleas, (2) by handling plague infected tissues of sick or dead animals, or (3) by inhaling infected droplets from pneumonic patients.

Plague season usually runs from May through September when rodents, fleas, and people are most active outdoors. Some of the animals that are carriers of the plague include rock squirrels, wood rats, prairie dogs, mice, gophers, wild rabbits, and domestic dogs and cats. To prevent plague around your house make it rodent proof by elevating woodpiles 6 inches off the ground, clean-up garbage, clean-up scattered pet food, clean-up rock piles, and clean-up brush. Also, keep your pets confined and dust pets weekly with approved flea powder.

Contact the City/County Vector Control Office at 873-6613, for flea or rodent control procedures if you find dead rodents or the sudden disappearance of rodents on your property.

Remember - always walk on the left side of the street against on-coming traffic.

## Walking dogs along the Domingo Baca Arroyo

Many residents utilize the unofficial trail along Domingo Baca Arroyo every day to exercise their bodies and their dogs. Domingo Baca is a very wide arroyo with a portion of it running between Morning Glory Road and Tramway Lane East of Bobcat Blvd. Some residents might mistake this area as "Open Space" when in fact it is entirely private property.

When dog owners walk their pets along the roadways they are normally leashed and orderly. But when they enter the arroyo some feel that a leash is not required. A few dogs go ballistic when unleashed and knock over our bird feeders and trample our landscape. The owners of these animals have allowed their pets to get out of their sight and aren't aware of the destruction they are causing.

Please respect this private property and keep your dogs leashed per the Bernalillo County Ordinance.
