## Friendly Reminder About RVs Covenant Support Committee

Your Covenant Support Committee (CSC) would like to pass along a friendly reminder regarding the longterm parking of recreational vehicles (RVs), travel trailers and boats in the Sandia Heights neighborhood. This is not a new issue within our community, and at times becomes a major irritant for other residents. Although the published covenants for the earliest developed units do not specifically spell out RVs, the Second Judicial Court in the late 1990s determined long-term parking of RVs, camper trailers and boats on all residential lots in Sandia Heights is prohibited. The court allowed parking of such vehicles for a period of no more than 48 hours for maintenance and provisioning.

The CSC does not police the neighborhood for violations; however, if a complaint is received, your homeowners association and the CSC will act upon it with the full authority and backing of the judicial system. We ask all residents with RVs, travel trailers and boats to be good neighbors, respect the rights of other residents and adhere to the covenants. Please keep in mind that the covenants are here to ensure we can continue to live in a pleasant community and maintain the value in our homes.

## Wildfire Preparedness: The "Go Bag" By the Wildfire Preparedness Planning Committee

You are lying in bed asleep when suddenly your phone sounds. It is the Nixel alert system or the Bernalillo County Emergency Alert System (that you signed up for using info on the SHHA web page). A brush fire has broken out in the open space behind Sandia Heights, and you are advised to evacuate. Smoke is already filling the air and outside you see flames in the distance. What critical items can you grab in the 5–10 minutes before you evacuate?

To prepare for such a situation, many emergency agencies recommend each household prepare a "go bag." Again, refer to the SHHA web page for two articles that suggest items to include in one or more backpacks. One article is entitled "Creating a Go Bag." A Bernalillo County handout entitled "How to be Prepared for an Emergency" also contains a section on what to include in a "home readiness kit."

However, some of these items may be used frequently and would be inconvenient to store in your togo backpack. In this case, a written list of these items to collect would help ensure nothing is left behind. This list can be kept in the backpack for easy, and easily found, reference.

How often have you gone on a trip and halfway there discovered you forgot to pack something important like your reading glasses or a critical medication? In a wildfire evacuation, when you are not thinking clearly, you may not be able to recover forgotten items-such as insurance documents, a Rolodex with critical phone numbers, your pet's meds and vaccination records. This is in addition to the standard recommendations such as clothing, food for three days, a first aid kit, an emergency radio, and flashlight. Each household's go bag would be specific for its members. Therefore, a useful exercise would be to sit down as a family and prepare the list. Teenagers may consider things critical that parents would omit and vice versa. All family members should be familiar with where all items are stored.

The creation of family and even individual go bags is an easy way to reduce somewhat the stress of what is sure to be a very bad day.



## Sandia Heights' Beautiful, Dark Skies By Susan McCasland, C&P Committee Chair

The absence of street lights and the restrictions on lighting for individual properties leads to one particularly beautiful result-dark skies. The ability to see the Milky Way has become a rarity in our illuminated world. Here are a few words from the International Dark Sky Association:

The nighttime environment is a precious natural resource for all life on Earth, but the glow of uncontrolled outdoor lighting has hidden the stars and changed our perception of the night.

The natural night sky inspires. Until recently, for all of human history, our ancestors experienced a sky brimming with stars-a night sky that inspired science, religion, philosophy, art and literature, including some of Shakespeare's most famous sonnets.

The natural night sky is our common and universal heritage, yet it's rapidly becoming unknown to the newest generations.

Van Gogh painted his famous "Starry Night" in Saint Rémy, France, in 1889. Now, the Milky Way can no longer be seen from there. If he were alive today, would he still be inspired to paint "Starry Night"?
